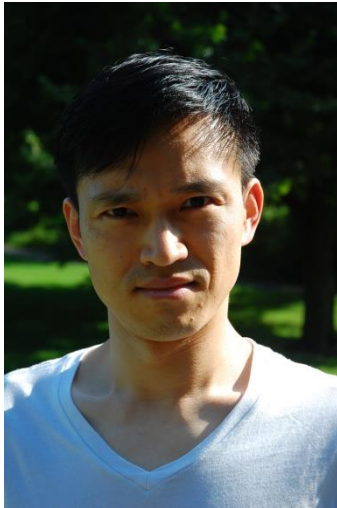


Minsu Park

Minsu Park received his Bachelor's Degree in Voice from Seoul Theological University in Korea, where he studied with Hyungu Yeo. His coaches include Hyemi Chun and William Hobbs. Park served as a member of Incheon City Professional Chorale, with which he was afforded the opportunity to perform in the United States as part of a concert at Carnegie Hall, at several ACDA festivals, and also in Japan and Taipei, among other cities. Park sang "Magnificat" by Bach, "Mass in G Major" by Schubert with the Musical Amateur, "Mozart Requiem" and "Haydn Requiem" with The Voices Choral and "Saint Paul" by Mendelssohn with CICS as a bass soloist. In addition to his strong background in choral performance, Park has been active in the operatic community as well, working with The Opera Project in Stockton and Eastern Opera of NJ. His operatic roles include "Germont" in La Traviata, "Rigoletto" in Rigoletto, and "Silvio" in Pagliacci. Recently, He has sung "Sharpless" in Madama Butterfly with Eastern Opera in NJ, and "Jago" in

Otello this August. Currently, Minsu resides in Plainsboro, New Jersey, with his wife Soyoung Kim. He is an active member of the Morrisville United Methodist Church Choir, where his wife serves as resident accompanist and organist.
